

Government Furnished Property (GFP) Registration & Marking Guide



DFARS 252.211-7007 requires that all Government Furnished Property (GFP) must be registered in iRAPT (Invoicing, Receipt, Acceptance and Property Transfer (formerly Wide Area Work Flow)). Additionally, serially managed GFP must be marked with a valid UID data matrix mark.

Follow these three steps to determine if your GFP meets DFARS 252.211-7007, and if you must comply, how to do so easily.

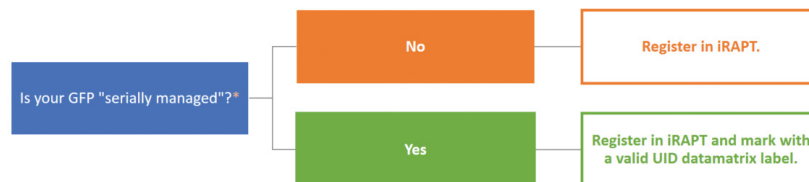
Step 1: Determine If You Have GFP

Government Furnished Property comes in three basic varieties:

- Items incorporated into a delivered good (e.g., specialized electronics)
- Repairable items that are to be returned to the DoD (e.g., engine rebuilding)
- Equipment used by manufacturers in the production of deliverables to DoD (e.g. special tooling)

You may have GFP and not realize it. Remember, GFP can transfer from contract to contract and contractor to contractor over many years. If you have DFARS clause 252.211-7007 in your contract, it is possible you have GFP.

Step 2: Does Your GFP Need To Be Registered Or Registered & Marked?



**Serially managed means "An item designated by DoD to be uniquely tracked, controlled, or managed in maintenance, repair and/or supply systems by means of its serial number."*

Step 3: How to Register Your GFP?

Complete the "Consolidated GFP Attachment" to register all GFP (serially managed or not).

Upload that attachment to iRAPT using your cage code at: www.dfas.mil/contractorsvendors/irapt.html.

Step 4: How To Mark Your GFP?

If your GFP is serially managed, you must apply a valid UID mark and register the individual items. A UID mark contains “a set of data elements marked on items that is globally unique and unambiguous.” The UII (data contained in the UID) is globally unique because it combines your company’s cage code along with unique data produced under that cage (serial number, part number, NSN, etc.).



The mark itself must contain a 2D data matrix barcode with that information formatted as defined in MIL-STD-130N, Identification Marking of U. S. Military Property. The mark is required to be “as permanent as the normal life expectancy of the item and be capable of withstanding the environmental tests and cleaning procedures specified for the item to which it is affixed”.
